Supply of many Orthopaedic Aids to disabled Children!



For the last 6-12 months we received an increasing number of requests for all sorts of Orthopaedic Aids for disabled children. CFWF is working together with OAALMAC Centre in Mumbai, where Mr. Solat and his team manufacture as per individual need: Callipers, Ortho-shoes, Crutches, Braces for arms & legs, Pelvic bands, Insoles, Corsets for supporting the spine & back, Traction-devices & others. We are glad to offer free help and service to poor families and their disabled children who are not able to pay for it due to economic constrains. Patients come from all over Mumbai & the State of Maharashtra. What a delight to see these children's lives change as they walk towards a brighter future! With increased funding in the future, CFWF will be able to extend help and assistance to a greater number of Disabled.



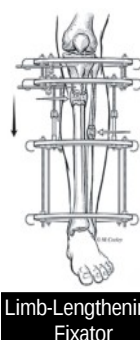

Correctional Surgeries at Shraddha Clinic / Manjula's Treatment

Free Medical Check-up under CFWF-Project available at Shraddha Clinic by Dr. P. Desai!

Many patients have received various Medical exams, consultations and diagnosis for treatment. Among several patients undergoing correctional surgery is 20 year-old Manjula Jankar from South Maharashtra. She suffers from deformities in her left leg due to Polio since infancy and has to support her leg with every step she takes, to keep it from caving in. After a check-up by Dr. Desai (2), the 1st stage surgery was carried out.



Limb-Lengthening Fixator



Manjula, with her mother, is seen recovering at the hospital(3) after having received 3 corr. surgeries simultaneously. Much of the deformity in her leg was corrected. A shortening of 2 inches remains in her left leg, for which a Limb-Lengthening procedure is scheduled. CFWF is waiting for new funding (Cost is INR 35,000/-) for Manjula to complete treatment.



Special Event at CFWF-Unit for underprivileged children

In a joint effort with the NGO **SPONSOR-A-BOOK**, volunteers of CFWF conducted an event and a small workshop for a group of disabled children presently in our treatment and care.

The children eagerly waited to receive the beautiful, laminated and highly motivating character-building poster books with simple, catchy English quotes. It was a truly beneficial and joyful event with nice interactions on the topic of education along with food served for all.

The story of little Tanay Singh and the plight of his family

Tanay (8) lives with his parents Sanjay and Geeta in a distant suburb north of Mumbai. From the age of 6 months he is disabled due to Cerebral Palsy, which left him with deformities in his arms and particularly in his legs. He is a bright and joyful little boy, mentally alert, but his bodily motor functions are lacking, as is usually the case with CP patients.

Due to his disability Tanay was not able to walk, nor could he stand upright on his own without support. Sanjay and Geeta contacted us and requested CFWF to sponsor a specially made walker with arm and leg braces for the boy. The family is suffering from economic hardship, because Sanjay lost his good job of being a company driver for 18 years. He hasn't been able to find a new job yet and it's a big burden on them. Both of them are nice people, of good character and we are now trying to help Sanjay get employment. Tanay is excitedly practising with his new Ortho-aids and begins with Physio exercises too. His parents are encouraged and very thankful for the help.

A Tribute to our friend, Dr. Colin Cunningham, Cambridge UK (†)



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Ten years ago Professor Dr. Cunningham came to know about our project and visited us in Mumbai with his wife Alisoun. As a historian documenting the spinning mills of India and the UK, his work brought him several times to India. Since getting to know about our project and work among the poor he was in regular, close contact, following its progress with great interest, introducing our project to Cambridge University and his local community.



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Working with Dr. Cunningham was a delight. His wife Alisoun, being a nurse, also took part in our activities, caring for patients at a Polio-Camp. In mid 2011 he informed us of him being diagnosed with cancer of a later state. In August we received the shocking news of his sudden death from his wife. We miss him greatly; his support and initiatives will always be remembered by us. We wish his wife and family strength and consolation.

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Comments to Patient Rafiq (1,2): 1) Polio-patient Rafiq (21) had a remarkable change for the better after successful corr. surgery. He now can walk with a temp. Calliper. 2) Limb-lengthening was diagnosed at a recent Med. exam by Dr. Desai, to correct 2 inches shortening in his right leg. Cost is same the as Manjula's: Rs35000/-



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Current Treatments / Patients waiting for Corr. Surgeries

Besides Rafiq, Manjula and Ashwini there are old and new patients waiting for correctional surgery and treatment. Other patients are requesting only Ortho-appliances. A few of them are listed briefly in this report:

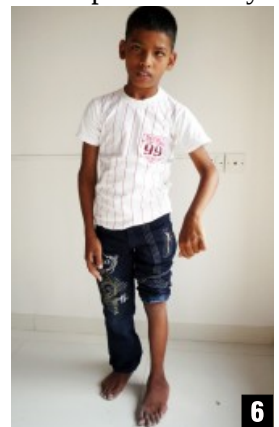
3) Fatima Shaikh (19) is suffering from serious deformities in both lower legs due to Polio Meningitis. She requires multiple corr. surgery. 4) Little Faizan (5) just received braces for his legs. He also needs a walker, regular Physio and another Med. exam. 5) Phiroz is an ex-patient who was helped from crawling to walking 10 years ago. He needs braces and a calliper. 6) Chandrashekhar (11) has CP & needs corr. surgeries to improve mobility.

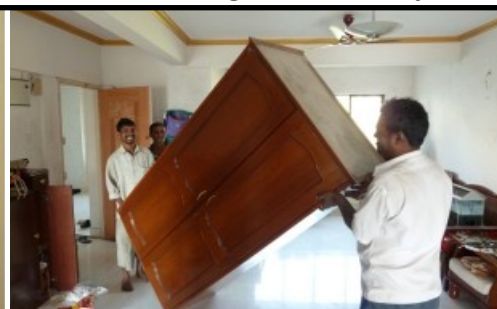
